PROJECT LIFESAVER

A rescue program for individuals with "Wandering Syndrome,"
A symptom common to many brain related disorders.

Project Lifesaver is a national, proactive, electronic tracking program used to assist in locating missing people. The Brunswick County Sheriff's Office offers this service for county residents who are caring for loved ones with Alzheimer's, Dementia or other special needs conditions, such as children with Down Syndrome or Autism Spectrum Disorder, who are likely to wander away from caregivers or have difficulty communicating with rescuers.



A lost child with Autism or Down Syndrome, or an adult wandering due to Dementia, constitutes a critical emergency and presents challenges to officers in search and rescue operations. While we cannot predict when a person will become lost, we can prepare.

We have teams of trained officers and special tracking equipment to help locate missing persons who are enrolled in the Brunswick County Project Lifesaver Program.

Project Lifesaver Offers Peace of Mind. A personalized state-of-the-art battery powered

transmitter, the size of a wrist watch, is worn by the person, and provides a unique radio signal 24 hours a day. If a person is missing, the care-giver immediately notifies 911.



Once the sheriffs office is notified that a person is missing, officers identify the signal from a specialized directional antenna and are able to track the wandering person. Officers use this equipment on foot, in cars and also by air, providing maximum coverage.

Search time has been reduced from hours or days to an average of 30 minutes.

Project Lifesaver is an active system that relies on technology to bring the missing person back home.



- All Brunswick County residents who qualify are eligible for free enrollment
- Must be diagnosed with Alzheimer's, Dementia, Down Syndrome, Autism, or other brain related disorders
- Must be currently cared for in the home
- Caregiver must be available to inspect



What is my next Step?

- Request an application from the Brunswick County Sheriff's Office.
- A deputy will come to the residence to meet with the individual and process the application.
- The deputy will come to the home monthly to service and change the battery.
